We had a lucky Crack the Cube winner this month. Chris Fuller cracked the last lock with key #2 winning himself \$900! A hard day's work Chris!

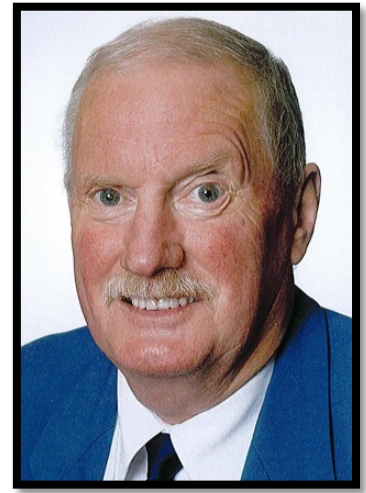
It's been great to watch the Crusader's play, undefeated so far this season. Hopefully the boys will keep it up.
